TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITES AND APPROVAL

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2010

The trustees are required by the Trust Property Control Act, 1988, and the trust deed, to maintain adequate accounting records and are responsible for the content and integrity of the financial statements and related financial information included in this report. It is their responsibility to ensure that the financial statements fairly present the state of affairs of the trust as at the end of the financial period and the results of its operations and cash flows for the period then ended, in conformity with its own accounting policies. The external auditors are engaged to express an independent opinion on the financial statements.

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with its own accounting policies and are based upon appropriate accounting policies consistently applied and supported by reasonable and prudent judgements and estimates.

The trustees acknowledge that they are ultimately responsible for the system of internal financial controls established by the trust and place considerable importance on maintaining a strong control environment. To enable the trustees to meet these responsibilities, the board of trustees sets out standards for internal control aimed at reducing the risk of error or loss in a cost - effective manner. The standards include the proper delegation of responsibilities within a clearly defined framework, effective accounting procedures and adequate segregation of duties to ensure an acceptable level of risk. These controls are monitored throughout the trust and employees are required to maintain the highest ethical standards in ensuring the trust's business is conducted in a manner that in all reasonable circumstances is above reproach. The focus of risk management in the trust is on identifying, assessing, managing and monitoring all known forms of risk across the trust. While operating risk cannot be fully eliminated, the trust endeavours to minimize it by ensuring that appropriate infrastructure, controls, system and ethical behaviour are applied and managed within predetermined procedures and constraint

The trustees are of the opinion, based on the information and explanations given by management, that the system of internal controls provides reasonable assurance that the financial records may be relied on for the presentation of the financial statements. However, any system of internal financial control can provide only reasonable, and not absolute, assurance against material misstatement or loss.

The trustees have reviewed the trust's cash flow forecast for the year to 31 March 2012 and, in the light of this review and the current financial position, they are satisfied that the trust has or has access to adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future.


Although the board of trustees is primarily responsible for the financial affairs of the trust, it is supported by the trust's external auditors.

Report on the financial statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of The Constitutional Court Trust, which comprise the trustees' report, statement of financial position as at 31 March 2010, and the statement of comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory notes set out on pages 4 to 18.

Trustees' responsibility for the financial statements

The trustees are responsible for the preparation and the fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting policies that are considered appropriate for such an entity. This responsibility includes : designing, implementing and maintaining internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

Auditor's responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing. These standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risk of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Basis for qualified opinion


In common with similar organisations, it is not feasible for the trust to institute accounting controls over income received by way of donations prior to the initial entry of the income in the accounting records. Accordingly, it was impracticable for us to extend our examination beyond the receipts actually recorded.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, these financial statements fairly present, in all material respects, the financial position of The Constitutional Court Trust as at 31 March 2010, and of its financial performance and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with its accounting policies.

Supplementary information

The supplementary schedules set out on pages 19 to 20 do not form part of the annual financial statements and are presented as additional information. We have not audited these schedules and accordingly we do not express an opinion on them.

TRUSTEES' REPORT

for the year ended 31 March 2010

1. Introduction

During the year 2009 – 2010, the Constitutional Court Trust continued to pursue its objectives: support of the Court library, including the development of the Court's website and SAFLII, a web-based virtual library accessible to users via the world wide web, support for the Constitutional Court law clerks' fellowship programme, as well as support for the artworks housed at the Court and for the administration of the Southern African Chief Justices' Forum.

2. Southern African Legal Information Institute (SAFLII)

The objective of SAFLII is to provide free electronic access to the law of southern and eastern Africa in the form of judgments and, it is hoped in the future, legislation. In its fourth year of operation, the project continued to grow. By the end of this financial year, SAFLII had expanded its content collection to more than 36,000 judgments from across Southern and East Africa. During the year, as well, SAFLII had an average of 6000 unique visitors per month.

Unfortunately, SAFLII underwent a major financial crisis during the year under review. After a trust investigation at the beginning of 2010, it became apparent that it was unavoidable that four staff members would have to be retrenched. The retrenchment took place at the end of March 2010.

In order to cover the shortfall for the financial year, the Trust approached the UK Friends of the South African Constitutional Court and the Claude Leon Foundation that made donations of approximately R1million and R100 000 respectively which left SAFLII with a small surplus at the end of the financial year. The grant made by the UK Friends of the South African Constitutional Court was a grant made to that Trust by the Rhodes Trust for the Court Library. The use of the funds for SAFLII was supported by the Rhodes Trust. The trustees would like to record their gratitude to these two organisations for the alacrity and generosity with which they made funds available to save SAFLII.

In addition to retrenching four members of staff, SAFLII, with the permission of the Chief Justice, Justice SS Ngcobo, was moved back to the premises of the Constitutional Court Library, which is fitting as SAFLII remains a project of the library. The savings resulting from the retrenchment and the move of SAFLII meant that SAFLII was able to reduce its monthly budget by more than half. Nevertheless, the project however continues to operate as it has done in the past and continues to collect judgements both locally and regionally. The cut backs in expenditure, however, have prevented any further expansion of SAFLII's work for the present.

The trustees would also like to thank the Carnegie Corporation of New York, the Open Society Foundation, the Open Society Institute for Southern Africa and the Ford Foundation

for their continued support for SAFLII this year.

3. Kindred bodies

The Friends of the South African Constitutional Court, charitable organisations established in the United Kingdom and in the United States continue to support the work undertaken by the Constitutional Court, and remain independent of the Trust (and of one another), with their own boards and administration.

4. Constitutional Court library

During the year, the Trust continued its support of the library in various ways. It also continued to support the development of an archive of the constitution-making process by employing a archivist and intern.

5. Law clerks' programme

5.1 General support

As in previous years, a donation from Atlantic Philanthropies received many years ago continued to be expended to support the orientation programme for law clerks held in January and July. The clerks programme remains an important one, both for the work of the Court and as a contribution to the training and advancement of aspirant constitutional lawyers.

5.2 Franklin Thomas Fellowship

This fellowship was established in honour of Franklin Thomas, former president of the Ford Foundation and now a board member of the Friends of the SA Constitutional Court (US). The fellowship enables former clerks of the Constitutional Court, preferably from a disadvantaged background, to study for a master's degree in the United States of America. Mr. R.M. Phooko has been awarded the fellowship for 2009 - 2010 at Notre Dame University. No donations towards the fellowship were received by the Trust during the financial year under review.

5.3 Ismail Mahomed Fellowship

This fellowship, established in honour of the late Chief Justice Ismail Mahomed, was made possible by a generous donation from Atlantic Philanthropies. A significant proportion of that donation is now held on behalf of the Trust by the UK Trust. Ms Emma Broster and Mr Ziyaad Minty have been awarded Ismail Mahomed fellowships for 2009 -2010 at the University of Michigan and Harvard University respectively. No donations towards the fellowship were received by the Trust during the financial year under review.

5.4 LWH Ackermann Fellowship

A new fellowship, established in honour of the former Constitutional Court Justice Laurie Ackermann was established for the 2008/09 academic year. This fellowship has been made possible through the support of the University of Virginia in Charlottesville. No scholarship was awarded for the 2009/2010 academic year due to financial constraints at the University of Virginia.

6. Artworks Project

The artwork collection continues to grow with donations received by international artists and court supporters both locally and abroad.

7. Southern African Chief Justices' Forum

The Southern African Chief Justices' Forum (previously known as the Southern African Judges Commission) was established in December 2003 to strengthen respect for human rights and the rule of law in the Southern African region by promoting judicial independence through liaison and cooperation between judges. The Commission's founding document has been duly signed and ratified by the chief justices and/or senior judges of Angola, Botswana, Lesotho, Malawi, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia, the Seychelles, South Africa, Swaziland, Tanzania, Uganda, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

The Commission is administered by Mr Tererai Mafukidze, who is based at the Constitutional Court, and its accounts are managed by the Trust. A separate set of financial statements is, however, to be prepared for the Commission to facilitate access to its accounts by the judicial representatives of the various member countries.

8. Trustees

Justices Cameron, Khampepe and Van der Westhuizen were appointed as new Trustees. Justice Kriegler, Professor Cassim and Advocate Mtshaulana resigned as trustees at the end of the financial year and this report was prepared by the acting chairperson of the Trust.

9. Administration of Trust

Ms Abeda Bhamjee, Ms Mimi Williams and Ms Elizabeth Moloto continued, during the period under review to provide services to the trust as coordinator, bookkeeper and administrator respectively. The trustees note their gratitude to each of them for their dedication to the work of the Trust.

10. Donors

Once again, the board wishes to express its gratitude to all its donors, not only for the generous grants made to the Trust but also for their enthusiasm for and interest in its various projects. Without their support, the Trust would not be able to continue.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. PRESENTATION OF ANNUAL FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The annual financial statements are prepared on the historical cost basis, except for financial instruments, which are reflected at fair value. Policies applied include the following principal accounting policies which, are consistent with those applied in the previous year :

1.1 EQUIPMENT

Equipment is reflected in the balance sheet at nominal value, in accordance with a decision made by trustees with effect from the 2006/7 financial year. The trust acquires equipment with funds raised from donors, and trustees have taken the view that the accounting treatment adopted is more appropriate for a donor-funded organisation.

1.2 ARTWORKS

Although artworks acquired through purchase and donation are assets of the trust, they are reflected in the balance sheet at nominal value. Trustees appointed consultants to conduct a valuation of the collection.

1.3 FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

Measurement

Financial instruments carried on the statement of financial position include investments, bank balances, accounts receivable and accounts payable. Financial instruments are initially measured at cost as at trade date, which includes transaction costs. Subsequent to initial recognition, the following instruments are measured as set out below :-

Investments

Investments in financial assets are initially recognised at cost. Subsequently, financial assets are re-measured at fair value through profit and loss.

Accounts receivable

Accounts receivable is stated at cost less provision for impairment losses.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents are measured at fair value.

Accounts payable

Accounts payable is stated at nominal value.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

1.4 PROVISIONS

Provisions are recognised when the trust has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation can be made.

1.5 REVENUE

Grants and donations

Grants and donations are accounted for in the year in which they are received. The trust neither accrues nor defers donor funding received after year end or in advance of the year in which it is to be spent. Appendices on pages 18 and 19 reflect unexpended balances of donor funding within individual projects of the trust. (Refer note 1.7)

Dividends

Dividends are brought to account on the last day for registration.

Interest

Interest is accounted for on the accrual basis.

1.6 EXPENDITURE

Expenditure is accounted for on the accrual basis.

1.7 PROJECT INCOME AND EXPENDITURE

In terms of its contractual obligations to donors, the trust's policy is to allocate project costs that are clearly identifiable as such directly against the project funds. Indirect and shared costs, as well as income items other than grants are allocated between project funds in the proportion that opening project fund balances plus current year grant receipts bear to aggregate project fund balances and current year grant income received.

1.8 FOREIGN CURRENCIES

Foreign currency transactions are accounted for at the exchange rates prevailing at the date of the transactions. Gains and losses resulting from the settlement of such transactions and from the transaction of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are recognised in the statement of comprehensive income.

Foreign currency balances held at year end are translated at year end exchange rates.

Trustees decided with effect from the 2006/7 year to write off costs incurred for additions to fixed assets and the artworks collection in the year of acquisition. The reason for this is that the trust is donor-funded and raises money specifically for the acquisition of such assets.

It is the view of trustees that writing off such assets against funds raised by the trust is more appropriate than the conventional accounting treatment of capitalising and depreciating such assets.

The trust will continue to maintain registers containing all necessary details of equipment and artworks acquired, as this is needed for control and insurance purposes. (Refer to note 15.)

9. TAXATION

No provision has been made for taxation as the trust is exempt from income tax in terms of section 10(1)(cN) as read with Section 30 of the Act.

10. GOING CONCERN

The existence of the trust is dependent on the continued support of its donors.

11. CURRENCY RISK

The trust is exposed to currency risk to the extent that funds are received from foreign donors, and that some funds are held on behalf of the trust by its kindred body in the United Kingdom.

12. INTEREST RATE RISK

The trust is exposed to interest rate risk, as it places funds at both fixed and floating interest rates. The risk is managed by maintaining an appropriate mix between fixed and floating rates and placings within market expectations.

13. CREDIT RISK

The trust's credit risk is attributable to investments and liquid funds. The credit risk on liquid funds is limited because the counter parties are banks with credit ratings assigned by international credit-rating agencies. The risk relating to the trust's investments is dealt with through an ongoing review of the risk profile provided to the fund managers.

14. LIQUIDITY RISK

The trust manages liquidity risk by monitoring forecast cash flows and ensuring that adequate reserves are maintained to meet anticipated obligations.

15. COLLECTION OF ARTWORKS

The process of acquisition is drawing to a close and the trustees obtained a valuation of the collection during the course of the financial year. A detailed listing of artworks is appended to these annual financial statements, and a detailed register has been compiled and will be maintained for control purposes.

16. LIBRARY

The trust purchases books and publications for the library and donates these on the condition that they remain the property of the Constitutional Court.
